Design specifications

As our flagship publication, the OE Progress Report should be presented in a visually engaging format and include data visualisations and graphic elements throughout in line with our visual identity brand guidelines.

The EITI International Secretariat will provide mock-ups for visual elements, but we expect our design partner to provide creative direction and expertise throughout the process. The EITI International Secretariat will provide and if necessary purchase photo material but welcomes photo suggestions from the design partner.

The report will be produced in up to three languages in A4 format. The final report should be delivered as PDF files. Artwork files (InDesign, Illustrator) will also be requested and should be included in the quote.

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Approach and theme

The report will seek to highlight the importance of beneficial ownership transparency as well as telling the story of Opening Extractives from its first year of implementation.

The report will highlight the key activities of the programme, focusing on the energy transition, the Beneficial Ownership Data Standard (BODS) and other applicable data standards, peer learning and data use. It will showcase country examples of beneficial ownership implementation and data use.

The report will also acknowledge the various challenges, setbacks and interruptions to Opening Extractives, e.g., political instability in Ukraine, the Covid 19 pandemic, as well as challenges around verification, privacy, security, complex structures and changes in ownership chains through time.

As our flagship publication, the report will also include information on key performance indicators and funding. The report should be presented in a visually engaging format and include data visualisations and graphic elements throughout.

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Draft outline
