2022 (80%) Moderate score


Malawi Corruption Case Study

- An extractive sector corruption case about an alleged bribery for a Mining License renewal
- Detected through an audio recording leaked by the social media
- It involved senior officials from the Ministry of Mining discussing with another investor on how they would use their powers to give him the license for the same mine and the amount of payment in return



Escalation of the Corruption Case

- Provoked hot debate on how to treat the case from EITI perspective
- CSOs boycotted the MSG meetings and rejected to approve the Malawi 4th EITI report
- Minister of Mining and the EITI Champion were involved to amicably solve the matter
- CSO's escalated the matter to the EITI International Secretariat for mediation
- This **risked meeting the deadline** for report submission



Actions Taken and Lessons Learnt

Actions taken by MSG:



- 1. **Reported** the allegation to the Anti-Corruption Bureau to investigate the case and take necessary action
- 2.Included the matter in the 4th EITI report
- 3. **Follow up the case** in subsequent reports
- 4. Requested the MoM to make a public statement about the allegation and take action against the officers involved



Lessons learned:

- 1. **Need for EITI National Anti-Corruption Strategy** to guide MSG in handling corruption cases
- 2. Importance of strengthening MSG rules of engagement
